Sports Premium Funding 2022/23



Background to the funding:

The Government has provided school sport funding in order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools, acting as a legacy of the Olympics in 2012. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, with money going directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Department for Education: Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium

ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools. Schools are held accountable for how they use the additional funding to support pupils' progress and participation in PE and school sport.

Allocation of funding: This academic year 2022-23 the school will receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil.

Rationale for PE / Sport Provision: Our rationale for the use of Sports Premium funding is that the school will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles;
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement;
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport;
- 4. A broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

How we plan to spend this year's allocation: The school has identified 5 Key strands for PE / Sport further development:

- Key Strand 1: Promote physical activity for all pupils (including those with physical SEND) through the provision of accessible, guality equipment / environment.
- Key Strand 2: Enhance the delivery of the PE curriculum through inset and sport specific coaches.
- Key Strand 3: Further increase inter school competition participation.
- Key Strand 4: Further increase active participation through increased out of hours learning and intra sport competitions.
- Key Strand 5: Promote a healthy lifestyle for all pupils.

The school has a detailed PE / Sport Action Plan which outlines planned actions, monitoring arrangements and success criteria (see below).

Impact:

We will evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation arrangements. We will look at how well we use our Sport Premium funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.
